Previous Ceremonies

Members of the Surrey Chapter UK on their annual Memorial Day ride out attended the October last Post. The weather was not great, but it was still good to see many motorcycles parked up.

October saw our first Individual Remembrance from conflicts this century, when we remembered Lance Corporal James Hill who was killed in Afghanistan on 8 October 2009. L/Cpl Hill's mother attended and said a few words about her son. It was an emotional and moving experience.



Our December ceremony was held just prior to the UK entering another lockdown period and we were joined by the Intelligence Corps as they were commemorating 80 years since their incorporation.

Members of the Corps laid a wreath and Colonel (retired) Nick Fox described the work of the Intelligence Corps.

The ceremony's poem for the day, untitled, was scratched on the wall of her prison cell in Budapest by Hannah Szenes, shortly before she was executed:

'One – two – three... eight feet long

Two strides across, the rest is dark...

Life is a fleeting question mark

One – two – three... maybe another week.

Or the next month may still find me here,



But death, I feel is very near.

I could have been 23 next July

I gambled on what mattered most, the dice were cast. I lost.'



Due to the Covid virus restrictions in the UK after Christmas, the January, February and March ceremonies were not announced and restricted to members of the BLP. There were no groups represented and the ceremonies were extremely short, with an Individual Remembrance and the sounding of The Last Post which was a recording from under the Menin Gate.
