Falklands Conflict

For many of us youngish ones, the Falklands Conflict was the first time we experienced our nation at war with another country. From April through to June 1982, the UK was at war with Argentina.

We will dedicate those months in 2022 to remembering the Falklands Conflict, with individual remembrances from across the services and the residents of the Falklands Islands themselves.

In May we are hopeful for a short parade from members of the Woking Royal Naval Association. The WRNA Standard Bearer is a regular attendee at BLP ceremonies.

Belgian Embassy in July

In July we have members of the Belgian Embassy joining us for a ceremony commemorating Belgian involvement in conflicts, particularly the people that worked with the British Special Operations Executive during the Second World War.

Last year the Belgian Defence Attaché joined us for our 80th Anniversary ceremony in July along with dignitaries from Woking Borough Council, including the Mayor of Woking.

Multi-faith Ceremony in August will see a number of faiths come together to remember those lost. We usually have around six faiths represented.

Previous Ceremonies

In October we were honoured to be joined by members of the Intelligence Corps and the Canadian Intelligence Corps. Col Fox (Retired) talked about the work of the Intelligence Corps and we remembered several members lost.



Woking District Scouts joined us in November with around 150 uniformed young people and leaders attending to listen to County Commissioner Joe Rogerson talk about



Private A.F. Griffith Williams, a Scout Troop Leader lost in WWI. The 1st Claygate Scout and Guide Band led a parade and a lone piper from Gordon's School played the Pipers Lament.

Woking District Scouts have held their annual

Remembrance ceremony since 2015 with us and we wish them luck later this year when they parade at the Menin Gate.

In December we welcomed many members of the Leccia family.

We remembered Lieutenant Marcel Mathieu René Leccia. Lieutenant Leccia was a member of the French Army and a prisoner of war during the second world war. After escaping, he ended up in the UK and joined the Special Operations Executive where he was parachuted into France in April 1944. Captured and deported to Germany, he was executed (hanged) at Buchenwald concentration camp on 12 September 1944. He is commemorated on Brookwood's Memorial to the Missing 1939-1945.



In January we heard a very detailed biography of Private Maynard Allen Paul of the Royal Army Canadian Medical Corps who had died exactly 80 years ago on the day of the ceremony. Paul McCue delivered a fascinating Individual Remembrance along with documents detailing Private Paul's brief life.



In February the Gordon's School Pipes and Drums paraded as we remembered Gunner Thomas Troy and Lieutenant André Bloch.



After most ceremonies, we often 'pop' round to the Trench Experience for refreshments in the recreation Belgian / French Estaminet. It's where the stories of Remembrance continue but in a more relaxed environment.
